FOCUS: USING INTERVENTIONS FOR STUDENT SUCCESS

PIEDMONT INTERMEDIATE

We are committed to meeting students where they are and building the academic scaffolding of interventions that will allow them to make gains throughout the year. Using multiple data points from different sources, such as Performance Matters, iStation, OSTP, and classroom assessments, we can fluidly provide targeted interventions along a continuum of services. All students are assessed quarterly through the iStation Indicators of Progress (ISIPTM), which creates a personalized plan for improvement regardless of the student's current level of understanding in math and reading. All students then access the self-paced program during Advisory time each week to work toward mastery.

Advisory time is also available for our math teachers to create short-term small groups that would benefit from additional math interventions, focusing on targeted skills. For all students, we are continuing to offer lunch-time opportunities to complete missing work and allow students to stay after school for Academic Enhancement. In addition, we are utilizing the unique situation of having students in classrooms earlier in the morning, which allows for more teacher-directed assistance

For our students who have demonstrated a more significant discrepancy in their current proficiency level in reading, we are thrilled to be able to enlist the expertise of our new Reading Specialist. Mrs. Sheetz has worked tirelessly to assess students, analyze the data, create easy-to-understand presentations for parents, and create small groups that can work in parallel to shore up specific skills that improve their learning across all content areas. She has also transformed an area within the library to create a space that provides students privacy, dignity, comfort, and success. We are excited for our students as they "test out" of enhanced reading intervention due to this collaboration.

PIEDMONT ELEMENTARY

W.I.N. Time (What I Need) is a school-wide intervention time that is implemented 5 days a week each morning for approximately 40 minutes. During this time, teachers provide interventions specific to each child's needs through programs such as iStation, Heart Words, Reading A-Z, Zoo Phonics, Rooted in Reading, and more.

The lessons used for this time focus on specific skills that students need extra practice on such as phonics, phonemic awareness, vocabulary, fluency, and more.









TAKE FLIGHT WITH AMY BIXLER, READING SPECIALIST NORTHWOOD ELEMENTARY

Take Flight is a program implemented by Academic Language Therapists that have completed a two-year program and certification process. This intervention is conducted in a small group format and uses multi-sensory instruction to remediate students struggling to learn to read. Students with even the lowest reading skills show advancement. This is our fourth year to serve students in Piedmont Schools using Take Flight. All three elementary schools have trained therapists providing this service.



PIEDMONT HIGH SCHOOL

Interventions are a critical component of learning at Piedmont High School. We currently offer tutoring to all students for English, Math, History, Science, Spanish, and Technology courses during their advisory periods. In addition, we are starting the process of offering after-school tutoring for Math and English.

We are utilizing data analytics from Performance Matters to identify standards students are not grasping in class to reteach necessary skills. Our curriculum department meets with teachers of core subjects on a monthly schedule. These meetings allow our staff to develop tests linked to state standards and help us identify standards that need remediation based on the data provided through Performance Matters. Once this remediation occurs, we look and see how the interventions have helped. Our ZAP program during lunch offers students a chance to make up assignments necessary for success.



SLB-STRUCTURED LANGUAGE BASICS PIEDMONT ELEMENTARY

Structured Language Basics (SLB) is a multi-sensory curriculum that addresses the needs of a variety of readers, from reading-disabled to gifted. SLB features instruction in phonological awareness, phonics, oral reading fluency, vocabulary, comprehension, grammar, handwriting, and spelling. Advanced syllable division and root-and-affix instruction prepare students to confidently attack multisyllabic words. Our team enjoys teaching SLB, knowing how good it is for students. We are seeing wonderful progress!



WILDCATS TAKE FLIGHT AT9 STONE RIDGE ELEMENTARY

Mrs. Wilcox teaches our students with indications of dyslexia. Take Flight is a Comprehensive Intervention for Students with Dyslexia that meets the criteria in all five components for a Comprehensive Dyslexia Program. Phonological Awareness: Auditory discovery, articulation of sounds, placement of production, and voicing. Mrs. Wilcox has had extensive training to help our students with needs in the area of dyslexia.



STONE RIDGE ELEMENTARY

Stone Ridge teachers look at monthly ISIP data and create small groups for their class for individualized reading instruction. These students are grouped according to need, then receive instruction in a small group setting to help them achieve success. This strategy also allows us to group students who need enrichment activities to further their progress.



MIDDLE SCHOOL OF PIEDMONT

Before school started, we began looking for ways to give the Math Department at Piedmont Middle School more opportunities to be purposeful and intentional and find a useful way to increase our math interventions and remediations. While building the master schedule, time was carved out for the math teachers to use their Advisory classes for that purpose. Starting early in the semester, teachers began to pull students into small groups and sought to reteach math concepts. Each Advisory class block has at least one math teacher available every day to host small group interventions. The math teachers have partnered with the Curriculum Department to identify specific standards and concepts that need to be addressed. Using student performance from daily work, tests, quizzes, and exit tickets, teachers have identified where students need additional work.

The 7th-grade interventions have focused on adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing integers. The 8th-grade teachers have focused on solving equations, integer rules, and solving/graphing inequalities. Most days you can find 5-10 students in each math classroom during Advisory. Students work hard during this time to relearn and practice skills they may have not mastered previously.

"Having time to remediate skills and even preview new ones is a game-changer for our students," said Mrs. Sydney Silva, Intro to Algebra Teacher. "Not only does it give them a chance to master concepts, but it also allows them to build confidence in math-- which is vital. Math interventions at the secondary level are imperative for student success."

We are proud of the extra work and time our Math Department has dedicated to our students. Our MSP mathematicians are growing daily in their skills and understanding, and we can't wait to see their academic gaps close as they work hard alongside their teachers.



W.I.N. TIME Northwood Elementary

W.I.N. Time (What I Need) is a school-wide intervention time to meet varying student needs, specifically in the area of reading. Teachers use research-based interventions such as iStation, Zoo Phonic, 6 Minute Fluency, Reading A to Z lessons, Heart Words, etc. These lessons focus on skills such as phonics, phonemic awareness, fluency, and comprehension skills. This time is uninterrupted and happens for 30-45 minutes 5 days a week.

MIC AWARENESS PIEDMONT EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTER

Some children develop phonemic awareness through literacy experiences at home before entering school, while others have limited exposure to print and role models who engage in reading and writing. Many students, regardless of their home experiences, will struggle with understanding phonemic awareness.

When our students experience difficulty with beginning reading skills, our teachers work collaboratively to collect data to help identify the problems. All students receive phonological awareness through our district curriculum, Zoo-Phonics, Heggerty Phonemic Awareness curriculum, and our reading curriculum, Wonders. All ECC students participate in 90 minutes of daily reading instruction.

We administer I-Station formative assessments monthly to monitor each

student's progress. Instruction is based on the individual need of each student: Tier 1 students receive whole and small group instruction from classroom teachers. Tier 2 students receive whole group and small group instruction with interventions provided by the teacher or teacher assistant. Tier 3 students receive whole group, small group instruction, intervention from the classroom teacher, and weekly small group sessions with our reading specialist.

Students who qualify as English Learners receive additional support from a digital platform, Imagine Learning. Imagine Learning programs teach critical skills to help students become proficient in phonological awareness, phonics, and vocabulary.

We are excited to announce our new partnership with Grand Canyon University. GCU is fully accredited and offers 100 percent online classes. Benefits of this partnership include 10 percent off tuition scholarship for graduate degrees and 15 percent off tuition scholarship for paraprofessionals (an approximate \$7,000 savings for a paraprofessional).

ACT & PSAT OPPORTUNITIES FOR PIEDMONT STUDENTS

PSAT Exam

The State Department of Education sponsored students from around the state to participate in the qualifying program for National Merit Scholars. Piedmont High School had 138 sophomores and juniors participate in taking the PSAT. Students will be notified in September of 2022 as to their qualifying status.

ACT Exam

Piedmont High School had 438 students take the ACT exam offered free of charge by the State Department of Education. Students took the test on October 5 at the high school. Students have received their test results, and district officials will examine results to evaluate the success of remediation programs we have implemented thus far.
